





Course Description: Spanish 2

Spanish 2 is designed to review and build upon material presented in Spanish I. The activities provided are designed to increase the student's proficiency in the four basic skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing. The program utilizes small group activities and students' involvement. It presents a more complex structure and awareness of the Spanish culture. Success in this class depends heavily on the student's cooperation, participation, curiosity and consistent practice in and out of class.

At the end of Spanish 2, the student should know:

- 3. Reflexive verbs
- 4. Verbs with special construction (gustar, encantar, faltar, disgustar...)
- 5. Expressions with tener
- 6. Possessive adjectives and agreement of adjectives
- 7. Affirmative and Negative (tu, ud, uds, nosotros) Commands
- 8. Preterite Regular and Irregular
- 9. Imperfect vs. preterite
- 10. Estar with past participle and/or used as adjectives
- 11. Saber vs. conocer
- 12. Direct and Indirect Object Pronouns
- 13. Stem-changing verbs
- 14. Por vs. para 1
- 15. The present subjunctive
- 16. Irregular verbs in the subjunctive
